## OBJECTIVE:

The Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) is required to undertake forest land management activities to develop, maintain, and enhance Indian forest land in accordance with the principles of sustained yield through the application of sound silvicultural and economic principles. Managing a forest for sustainability requires a perpetual source of information to guide its development on a long term basis.

This Scope of Work is intended to cover the tasks required to develop, maintain, and enhance Indian forest land managed by the BIA.

## REQUIREMENTS:

1. Must be 18 years of age or older.
2. Must commit to eleven (11) consecutive weeks of employment.
3. Ability to work irregular work hours and periodic long days.
4. Must have a valid driver license or the ability to obtain a driver's license.
5. Ability to drive and operate 4 wheel drive vehicles (UTVs.)
6. Ability to learn the use and care of forestry tools and instruments.
7. Ability to work and perform under the following physical demands/work environment:
  - Ability to work outdoors in rugged terrain--steep, wet, muddy, rough uneven or rocky surfaces.
  - Ability to provide suitable work clothes such as hiking boots, rain gear and other personal items.

- Ability to backcountry hike on and off trail.
- Ability to carry a 25+ pound pack while hiking in elevations ranging from 3,000 to 7,000 feet above sea level.
- Ability to perform physical exertions such as bending, crouching, stooping, stretching, and reaching regularly and without injury.
- Ability to tent-camp for up to four nights away from town.
- Ability to work cooperatively with other people.
- Ability to report to work promptly at 8:00 a.m. each work day and remain working into the afternoon to at least 6:30 p.m.

## **DUTIES:**

### **Perform basic tree measurements on specified plots.**

Forestry technicians will be required to complete tree measurements required as part of the Continuous Forest Inventory (CFI) to gather data required for monitoring of a forest for stocking, growth, and yield capacity. To ensure consistency between BIA, tribal, and student CFI crews, the BIA will provide all forestry measurement tools necessary to complete the project work. Prior to undertaking project work, the BIA will provide training on completing required measurements and recording data. Forestry technicians will have knowledge of, exposure to, and experience using basic forestry tools to perform basic tree measurements. Forestry tools utilized will include, but are not limited to: Biltmore stick, diameter tape, relaskop, clinometer, range finder, increment borer, GPS, and field data recorders.

### **Accurately record measurement and plot data.**

Forestry technicians will be required to accurately record all measurement and plot data. The BIA will provide field data recorders (FDR) or paper forms. Prior to undertaking project work, the BIA will provide training on utilizing a FDR. The BIA will provide quality control foresters to assist forestry technicians in the field and to monitor the crew's measurements to ensure accuracy.

### **Data entry of measurement and plot data.**

Forestry technicians may be required to enter the recorded measurements and plot data into Forest Vegetation Simulator (FVS), BOFRP\_APPS, or other forestry applications from data downloaded from the FDR. If data entry is required, the BIA will provide training to the forestry technicians on how to enter the necessary data.
